



#### FIRST LESSON: ISAIAH 25: 6 – 9

In the banquet feast of heaven about which Isaiah is prophesying, the shroud of death is destroyed once and for all. Death came to all people because all have sinned, but Jesus, our Redeemer, restores us back to the Father through his righteousness; by faith in Christ, we are restored.

On this mountain, the Lord of Armies will prepare for all peoples a banquet of rich food, a banquet of aged wines, with the best cuts of meat, and with the finest wines. On this mountain, he will destroy the shroud that covers all peoples, the burial cloth stretched over all nations. He has swallowed up death forever! The Lord God will wipe away the tears from every face. He will take away the shame of his people throughout the earth. For the Lord has spoken. On that day, it will be said, "Look, here is our God! We waited for him, and he saved us! This is the Lord. We waited for him. Let us be glad and rejoice in his salvation!"

SECOND LESSON PHILIPPIANS 4: 4 – 14

Rejoice in the Lord! Paul's refrain echoes through these verses to focus our attention on Christ. Paul reminds us that this happens through prayer, petition, and thanksgiving; we bring all our needs and wants before God in prayer, demonstrating our dependency on the Lord. We are content knowing that he will provide us with everything we need.

Rejoice in the Lord always! I will say it again: Rejoice! Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not worry about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if anything is excellent, and if anything is praiseworthy, think about these things. The things that you learned, received, heard, and saw in me: Keep doing these things. And the God of peace will be with you.

I rejoice greatly in the Lord now that you have revived your concern for me once again. Actually, you were concerned, but you had no opportunity to show it. I am not saying this because I lack anything; in fact, I have learned to be content in any circumstances in which I find myself. I know what it is to live in humble circumstances, and I know what it is to have more than enough. I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, while being full or hungry, while having plenty or not enough. I can do all things through Christ, who strengthens me. Nevertheless, you did well by becoming partners with me in my affliction.

# VERSE OF THE DAY

GOSPEL MATTHEW 22: 1 – 14

Our lesson is the wedding feast parable and the third parable directed towards the religious leaders. We see God's mercy in this parable that even with their rejection of Him, the Christ, Jesus still tries to turn them from unbelief to repent of their sins. With this parable, He tells them what the kingdom of heaven is like; many do not enter because they reject God's invitation.

After the announcement of the Gospel, the congregation sings:



Jesus spoke to them again in parables. He said, "The kingdom of heaven is like a certain king who prepared a wedding banquet for his son. He sent out his servants to summon those who were invited to the wedding banquet, but they did not want to come.

"Then he sent out other servants and said, 'Tell those who are invited: Look, I have prepared my dinner. My oxen and my fattened cattle have been butchered, and everything is ready. Come to the wedding banquet!'

"But those who were invited paid no attention and went off, one to his own farm, another to his business. The rest seized the king's servants, mistreated them, and killed them. As a result, the king was very angry. He sent his army and killed those murderers and burned their town. "Then he said to his servants, 'The wedding banquet is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy. So go to the main crossroads and invite as many as you find to the wedding banquet.'

Those servants went out to the roads and gathered together everyone they found, both good and bad, and the wedding hall was filled with guests. But when the king came in to see the guests, he saw a man there who was not wearing wedding clothes. He said to him, 'Friend, how did you get in here without wearing wedding clothes?' The man was speechless. Then the king told the servants, 'Tie him hand and foot and throw him into the outer darkness where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.' For many are called, but few are chosen."

He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who in unity with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy Christian and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.


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#### TO GOD BE THE GLORY

Move us to support missionaries at home and overseas with our sincere prayers and generous offerings.


