





### FIRST LESSON: ISAIAH 52: 1 – 16

Isaiah prophesies to captive Israel who is sleepwalking through life, because they are lost in the stupor of grief over their afflictions. "Awake!" the prophet cries, and hear God's promise of coming triumph that will give you strength to face your present problems. God would reveal his glory by redeeming his people and leading them safely home. Captive Israel here is a picture of the waiting Church, and one day God will fulfill this promise also in us.

Listen to me, you people who pursue righteousness, you people who seek the Lord! Look confidently to the rock from which you were hewn and to the quarry from which you were cut. Look confidently to Abraham your father, and to Sarah, who gave birth to you. Yes, when I called him, Abraham was only one person, but I blessed him and multiplied him. The Lord is certain to comfort Zion. He will comfort all her ruins. Certainly he will make her wilderness like Eden and her wasteland like the garden of the Lord. Joy and gladness will be found in her, thanksgiving and the sound of music.

Pay attention to me, O my people. My nation, listen to me! For the law will go out from me, and I will establish my justice as a light to the peoples. My righteousness is near. My

salvation goes forth, and my arms will bring justice to the peoples. The seacoasts will wait for me. They will have confidence in my arm. Lift up your eyes to the heavens. Look closely at the earth beneath, because the heavens will vanish like smoke, and the earth will wear but like a garment, and its inhabitants will die like gnats.

But my salvation will remain forever, and my righteousness will never be abolished. Listen to me, you people who know righteousness, you people who have my law in your hearts. Do not fear the insults of men, and do not be discouraged by their abuse. Because a moth will consume them like a garment, and its worm will consume them like wool. But my righteousness will remain forever, and my salvation will last for all generations.

Wake up! Wake up! Clothe yourself with strength, you arm of the Lord! Awake as in days of old, as in generations of long ago. Was it not you who cut Rahab to pieces, and who pierced the sea monster? Was it not you who dried up the sea, the waters of the great deep, and who made a road through the depths of the sea for the redeemed to cross over? Then those ransomed by the Lord will return. They will enter Zion with a joyful shout, and everlasting joy will crown their heads. Happiness and joy will overtake them. Sorrow and sighing will flee away.

I, even I, am the one who comforts you. Who are you, Zion, that you fear humans, who die, or a child of Adam, who passes away like grass? You have forgotten the Lord, your Creator, who stretches out the heavens, who makes the earth stand firm. You tremble continually all day, because of the rage of the oppressor, who is preparing to destroy. But where is the rage of the oppressor now? The prisoner will soon be released. He will not die and go to the pit, and he will not lack bread.

I am the Lord your God, who stirs up the sea so that its waves roar. The Lord of Armies is his name! I have placed my words in your mouth, and with the shadow of my hand I have covered you—I, who planted the heavens and laid the foundations of the earth, I, who say to Zion, "You are my people."

#### SECOND LESSON

#### 1 THESSALONIANS 4: 13 - 18

To the new Christians in Thessalonica, Paul explains the certain hope we have to be saints triumphant. His words are so simple, yet so profound! We believe that Jesus died and rose again, and so we believe that all who die in Christ will go with him to heavenly triumph. And we will be with the Lord forever. This is the crown jewel of the Christian faith: blessed are the dead who die in the Lord from now on.

We do not want you to be uninformed, brothers, about those who have fallen asleep, so that you do not grieve in the same way as the others, who have no hope. Indeed, if we believe that Jesus died and rose again, then in the same way we also believe that God will bring with him those who have fallen asleep through Jesus.

In fact, we tell you this by the word of the Lord: We who are alive and left until the coming of the Lord will certainly not go on ahead of those who have fallen asleep. For the Lord himself will come down from heaven with a loud command, with the voice of an archangel, and with the trumpet call of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first. Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up in the clouds together with them, to meet the Lord in the air. And so we will always be with the Lord. Therefore, encourage one another with these words.

#### VERSE OF THE DAY


Alleluia. They are before the throne of God and serve him day and night in his temple. Alleluia. (Revelation 7:15a)



GOSPEL MATTHEW 25: 1 – 13

Jesus pictures the time before his return as virgins waiting for a bridegroom and the start of a wedding feast. The parable divides all people (ten virgins) into two groups: foolish and wise. They weren't described that way because of what they did in the parable, but their actions showed what they were.

After the announcement of the Gospel, the congregation sings:



"At that time the kingdom of heaven will be like ten virgins who took their lamps and went out to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish, and five were wise. When the foolish ones took their lamps, they did not take any oil with them; but the wise took oil in their containers with their lamps. While the bridegroom was delayed, they all became drowsy and fell asleep. But at midnight there was a shout, 'Look, the bridegroom! Come out to meet him!' Then all those virgins got up and trimmed their lamps. The foolish ones said to the wise, 'Give us some of your oil because our lamps are going out.' But the wise answered, 'No, there may not be enough for us and for you. Instead, go to those who sell oil and buy some for yourselves.' But while they were away buying oil, the bridegroom came. Those who were ready went in with him to the wedding banquet, and the door was shut. Later, the other virgins also came and said, 'Lord, Lord, let us in.' But he answered, 'Amen I tell you: I do not know you.' Therefore, keep watch, because you do not know the day or the hour.




#### Nicene Creed


We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.




#### **WORDS OF INSTITUTION**


