First Sunday of Advent

**WELCOME, GUESTS!!!** We are so glad you came! If you have any questions or would like more information about our church, any member of Grace would be happy to speak with you. Please take the time to fill out a guest register at the church's entrance. Restrooms are located to the left as you exit the sanctuary. Congregational responses are indicated by indent and boldened letters.

**ADVENT SEASON** - Brings a close to "End times" and starts a new church year. With Advent, we change the colors to blue for the royalty, representing the hope and anticipation of our King who comes through the manger. Jesus came to accomplish our redemption. He comes today in the means of grace to distribute that redemption. He will come again on the last day in our resurrection. As we begin this new year, we use a 16th-century tradition of lighting the Advent wreath. The candle lighting focuses our attention on Jesus, our brother, and the light of the world.

The wreath is in a circular garland to represent life in eternity. Each of the four candles represents a thousand years from the promise to the fulfillment of the prophecy. The lighting of the first candle is the "Prophecy Candle," remembering the prophets who foretold of Christ's coming. The second candle is the "Bethlehem Candle," representing the love of Christ to come to the manger. The third candle is the "Shepherds Candle" this is the pink candle reminding us of the shepherd's joy. The fourth candle is the "Angels Candle," embodying the peace of the message brought by the angels. The center candle is the "Christ Candle" it is the center candle and depicts the life of Christ and the purity he has brought into the world. We remember Isaiah's words, "though our sins are like scarlet, they will be as white as snow."

## FIRST LESSON: ISAIAH 63: 16B, 17; 64: 1 – 8

Throughout history he has promised to come in grace to rescue those who are ready and to come in judgment on those who could not be bothered with him. In the Old Testament he came in his mighty acts to rescue the Church always on the brink of perishing among those who did not watch and did not prepare

Our Redeemer from everlasting is your name. Why do you cause us to wander from your ways, Lord? Why do you harden our heart so that we do not fear you? Return for the sake of your servants, the tribes that are your heritage.

Oh, that you would rip open the heavens and come down. Mountains then would quake because of your presence. As fire ignites stubble and as fire makes water boil, make your name known to your adversaries. Then nations would quake in your presence. You did amazing things that we did not expect. You came down. Mountains quaked because of your presence. From ancient times no one has heard. No ear has understood. No eye has seen any god except you, who goes into action for the one who waits for him. You meet anyone who joyfully practices righteousness, who remembers you by walking in your ways! But you were angry because we sinned. We have remained in our sins for a long time.

Can we still be saved? All of us have become like something unclean, and all our righteous acts are like a filthy cloth. All of us have withered like a leaf, and our guilt carries us away like the wind. There is no one who calls on your name, who rouses himself to take hold of you. So you hid your face from us. You made us melt by the power of our guilt. But now, Lord, you are our father. We are the clay, and you are our potter. All of us are the work of your hand.

1 CORINTHIANS 1: 3 – 9



GOSPEL MARK 13: 32 - 37


Those who are busy doing their own thing, serving self, looking only for the cute and entertaining things that have become such a part of the world's Christmas culture, will not be ready for either his coming in grace or his coming in judgment.

"No one knows about that day or hour, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. Watch! Be alert and pray, because you do not know when the time will come. It is like a man going away on a journey. When he left his home, he put his servants in charge and assigned what each one was to do. He also commanded the doorkeeper to keep watch. Therefore keep watch, because you do not know when the owner of the house is coming: whether in the evening, or at midnight, or when the rooster crows, or early in the morning. If he comes suddenly, do not let him find you sleeping. What I say to you, I say to everyone: Keep watch!"

#### NICENE CREED




