

## FIRST LESSON:

Isaiah 61: 1 – 3, 10, 11

It is an astonishing thing that so many are not satisfied with the salvation that God provides in the coming Christ, the Christ proclaimed by faithful forerunners. For that salvation is like gold compared to the tinsel that so many favor instead.

The Spirit of the Lord God is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me to preach good news to the afflicted. He sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, you proclaim freedom for the captives and release for those who are bound, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor and the day of vengeance for our God, to comfort all who mourn, to provide for those who mourn in Zion, to give them a crown of beauty instead of ashes, the oil of joy instead of mourning, a cloak of praise instead of a faint spirit, so that they will be called oaks of righteousness, a planting of the Lord to display his beauty.

I will rejoice greatly in the Lord. My soul will celebrate because of my God, for he has clothed me in garments of salvation. With a robe of righteousness he covered me, like a bridegroom who wears a beautiful headdress like a priest, and like a bride who adorns herself with her jewelry.

For as the earth produces its growth, and as a garden causes what has been sown to sprout up, so God the Lord will cause righteousness and praise to sprout up in the presence of all the nations.

GOSPEL JOHN 1: 6 – 8, 19 – 28

John was God's spokesman called to prepare the people for the Savior who comes in grace and in judgment. Especially those who came to question him should have known that. For everything that he said and did was in complete agreement with the Word of God.

After the announcement of the Gospel, the congregation sings:



There was a man, sent from God, whose name was John. He came as an eyewitness to testify about the light so that everyone would believe through him. He was not the light, but he came to testify about the light.

This is the testimony John gave when the Jews from Jerusalem sent priests and Levites to ask him, "Who are you?"

He confessed and did not deny. He confessed, "I am not the Christ."

And they asked him, "Who are you then? Are you Elijah?"

He said, "I am not."

"Are you the Prophet?" "No," he answered.

Then they asked him, "Who are you? Tell us so we can give an answer to those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?"

He said, "I am the voice of one crying out in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way of the Lord,' just as Isaiah the prophet said." They had been sent from the Pharisees. So they asked John, "Why then do you baptize, if you are not the Christ, or Elijah, or the Prophet?"

"I baptize with water," John answered. "Among you stands one you do not know. He is the one coming after me, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to untie."

These things happened in Bethany beyond the Jordan, where John was baptizing.



NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.



Come, Lord Jesus! Amen.


# LORD'S PRAYER


WORDS OF INSTITUTION


